

# 2025 KANSAS ONE SHOT TURKEY HUNT A SUCCESS

Determining success in any organization can be challenging, especially in a multifaceted event like the Kansas One Shot Turkey Hunt. Based on responses from our recent survey, the Board of Directors believes that 2025 was a standout year.

This year, we had 43 hunters, and an impressive 31 of them successfully bagged a turkey, resulting in a remarkable success rate. Three of the five Kansas youth were successful, with Creighton from Rossville earning second place. Additionally, two American Heroes were able to harvest their birds as well.

Kansas Attorney General Kris Kobach won the Big Tom Award for the second time, with valuable assistance from guide Warren Rensner.

We presented the first Marvin L McCown Memorial Scholarship to Ashton Sell of Goddard. Ashton will be going into wildlife biology in hopes to become a game warden.

This year, we started a vendor area at the Butler County Community Building during weigh in. We had six vendors and hope to grow this segment in the years to come.

## **KOSTH BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

Have you thought about being a board member for the Kansas One Shot Turkey Hunt? Wonder what that entails? Well, here is a little

- We have board positions open every year. Once elected, a board member will serve a three-year term and after one year is eligible to move into an Executive position.
- Board members may serve two consecutive three-year terms, then must take at least one year off to be nominated to the board
- The board is a working board, and members must sign up to serve as chair or on a committee of the organization.
- Meetings are held once a month. The governance items are handled first, then the program items are discussed.
- The Board sets policy, and staff manage. (We are in the process of hiring staff)
- Board meetings are by Zoom for those out of town or State and local people come to the Hunt office.

### **ZUNI TRIBE VISITS THE KOSTH**

Many years ago, during the Governor's Hunt, a representative from the Zuni Tribe in New Mexico came to gather feathers to take back home. They had not attended the hunt for several years.

This year, Governor Hayden requested that we reconnect and rebuild our relationship with the tribe. A connection was successfully made, and we were fortunate to have Matthew Neha and Stafford Chimoni attend the hunt. They are employees with the Zuni Fish and Wildlife.

After the birds are harvested, the volunteers will breast them for the hunters or prepare them to be donated. Matthew and Stafford collected the feathers and worked closely with the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, which is still conducting studies on the harvested birds.

These men were very gracious and answered many questions about the uses of the feathers, which are intended for ceremonial purposes, offerings, and more.

We hope to continue this relationship for future hunts.





The Zuni Indian Reservation is located in the western portion of New Mexico and sits adjacent to the Arizona State line. The Reservation encompasses approximately 465,600 acres, including the Mazone Ranch, a Tribal Trust land. This makes the Zuni Pueblo the largest of the 19 Pueblos of New Mexico, with elevations ranging from 6,200 ft to 7,800 ft. Topography is characterized primarily by breathtaking mesas with deep and extensive gullies and canyons, dominated by Pinyon-juniper woodlands, Ponderosa Pine/Pinyon, sagebrush, and grassland areas.
